Also, the hike in price of gasoline which resulted in high cost of transportation alongside the problem of insecurity were major obstacles. More communities would have been reached if not for these afore mentioned problems. We had to trek most of the time, covering up to 3-5km before getting to the designated community. The ban on the use of bikes in some places made reaching more communities difficult.

However, we thank God for the success of the exercise and the testimonies recorded during the period. For instance, we were informed by a parent of one of the children in Lord's Chosen Primary School Konlo who also is an Anglican church Pastor that after his son took the worm medicine in school, he came back home and excreted lots of worms. The Pastor was so thankful and requested we come to his area and administer the deworming medication to his people.

Some people from new communities like the village heads of Sabon pege and Diggi who had once taken the worm medicine in Konlo sometime ago were really excited that their villages were reached this time around. They went around mobilizing and informing their people of the goodnews of our arrival in their community to administer the worm drugs.

In Bainde Primary School which we visited for the very first time, God was very gracious as the people welcomed us without much protocol. The village head came in person to welcome us and the children were very excited. They asked that we come again.

As usual, the journey started from Abuja through Bauchi to Yola, Vere and Koma hills in Adamawa State, Nigeria. We visited new communities and schools such as Bainde primary school and The Lord's Chosen primary school Konlo. We visited new communities in Koma area namely:

- Sabon Pege community
- Diggi community
- Kwakapa community and
- Basabulu community

A total number of 13 schools and 9 communities with about 4240 children and adults were dewormed: over 70% of the total population dewormed were children.
